The Tithe Barn is often referred to as "Rupert's Barn" because, on the eve of the battle of Marston Moor on 2nd July 1644 during the English Civil War, Prince Rupert, a nephew of Charles 1st and a leading Royalist General, is said to have stationed his troops in the barn overnight after having crossed the river nearby.
