Survey shows trend towards smaller families

Each year when we invite children to apply for a place in our schools, we also take the opportunity to collect more information on the children and their families in the 80 villages in our catchment area.

Over the years we have been happy to notice some positive changes, for example, the number of children coming to us with various illnesses like polio. At one time we counted 10 children in one year at Guria with post-polio deformities. This year there were no new ones and only one amongst our total school population.



Another noticeable change is the number of children that are married. Anil recalls that when he joined Project Mala in 2003, we only had primary schools and there were five children in Guria alone who were married. Now in our total schools covering pre to secondary level, there is only one girl, Sanju, who is married but she is in the final years of our secondary school.

More recently family sizes have been decreasing. The chart shows that even over the last 10 years the average number of siblings per family is down.

India has been trying to halt the population growth for years to reduce the birth rate, from free contraceptives to

paying women to be sterilised.

One thing that is not decreasing is competition for places in our schools. The intake chart shows that we have almost six children for every place.

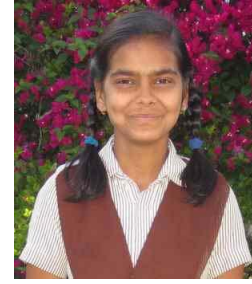
